## Chapter 10

## Two Thousand And Beyond

With Dr. Tilghman L. Moore as the twenty-fourth Province Polemarch, the Northeastern Province entered the second millennium with forty chartered active chapters, thirty chartered alumni chapters and one chartered alumni association in seven states, the British Isles and Western Europe. The current Province boundaries extend from the tip of New England in the north to Western Europe in the east, through Delaware to the south and Pennsylvania to the west. While there are a large number of chartered chapters on roll, twenty active chapters and five alumni chapters have become inactive. One of the challenges facing the Northeastern Province in the new millennium is to reactivate as many inactive chapters as possible.

### Northeastern Province Councils during Two Thousand and Beyond

The Northeastern Province Council continued to be lavish, entertaining and constructive. The council meetings followed the same format of the nineties, including an initiation ceremony. The first Northeastern Province Council Meeting of the second millennium was hosted by Hartford Alumni on March 30 to April 2, 2000 at the Farmington Marriott in Hartford, Connecticut. At this Council Meeting, Northeastern Province Historian McKinley Wardlaw, Jr. presented a plan to the body to write *The History of the Northeastern Province*. Each chapter was asked to send to the Province Historian their chapter history, pictures and any other historical data from their archives. The information could be sent via e-mail at no cost to the province.

Newark Alumni hosted the second Northeastern Province Council Meeting of the new millennium on March 8-11, 2001, at the Sheraton Airport Hotel in Newark, New Jersey. At the meeting, the Province Historian reported that he had received chapter histories from 50% of the active undergraduate chapters and 75% of the active alumni chapters. Inactive chapters did not respond. The staff at International Headquarters had made Grand Chapter historical data available to the Province Historian and had allowed him to use the International Headquarters' copy machines to record historical data pertaining to the province. William E. Baker of Englewood-Teaneck Alumni and Northeastern Province Life Membership Chairman and Harold L. Harmon of Dover Alumni and Present Keeper of Records made the chapter archives available to the Northeastern Province Historian.

The first draft of the First Edition of <u>The History of the Northeastern Province</u> was expected to be completed in the summer of 2001.

## C. Rodger Wilson Leadership Conferences

Since initiation resumed in 1996; however, after initiations were conducted, many chapters became derelict in submitting training reports and other reports required by the Province. The failure to meet the deadline for submitting these reports became a concern to the Province Polemarch and the Board of Directors.

The first C. Rodger Wilson Leadership Conference in the second millennium was hosted by Xi Gamma Chapter and Burlington-Camden Alumni Chapter during the period October 27-28, 2000 at Rowan University in Glassboro, New Jersey. At this meeting, Northeastern Province Senior Vice Polemarch Michael Brewington reiterated to the chapters that Northeastern Polemarch Tilghman L. Moore had begun to rethink the wisdom of having Province-wide initiations at C. Rodger Wilson Leadership Conferences. He proposed to have one annual Province initiation, which would include all training, at Northeastern Province Council Meetings. New brothers would receive all of their credentials at the end of the Council Meetings. Such a strategy would (1) eliminate the need for training reports from local chapters; (2) continue standardized training; and (3) assist in reactivating the inactive chapters on college campuses throughout the Province. Further mandatory training for new brothers at local chapters would be discontinued

### Northeastern Province Life Membership

In the new millennium, Chapter Invisible and Province transfers continue to create vacancies on the life membership roll. The cost of life membership is still \$200 and life memberships are being purchased as fast as vacancies occur.

#### **Northeastern Province Web Site**

In the new millennium. The official web site of the Northeastern Province *http//www.kapsi-nep.com* was created. The web site includes the following: general information, Province calendar, Province officers, Province chapters, membership intake schedule and the Province store. Pictures of recent events are also included. The web site, along with e-mail, provides instant communication between the Province, local chapters and individual brothers. In the Northeastern Province, holding a Province office or a local chapter office without access to this new technology has become unthinkable.

## The History of Abington-Ambler Alumni Chapter

### The Krystalization of AAA-

The Abington-Ambler Alumni Chapter (AAA) was chartered Saturday October 22, 2005. Situated between two of the largest Chapters in the Northeastern Province, the impetus for the chapters formation was not a question of regional representation but more a matter of purpose.

The overwhelming purpose being to serve as a bridge; A bridge between tradition and innovation, between the undergraduate and the Alumni, between the vigor and exuberance of youth and that good Ol' Kappa Spirit. As many of our Brothers must cross this bridge post graduation, it is our goal to serve as an intermediate between the two levels of our fraternity.

It was with this purpose in mind that Brothers met on the evening of June 21, 2004 to investigate the need, benefit, and challenges associated with the possible formation of a new Chapter of our Noble Klan in the Montgomery County area of PA.

Though a number of qualifying areas were discussed, it was the determination of the committee that since the placement of the chapter would be key to it's success it should therefore need to be positioned where it could be the most beneficial to the community, to the Brothers residing in the area, and to the Fraternity. It was decided that Cheltenham and Abington, being the second and third most densely populated areas by African Americans , would be the ideal placement for a new chapter.

Further Investigation would reveal that areas such as Cresmont, Willow Grove and Roslyn had burgeoning African American communities with schools and churches, but sparsely any African American Organizations.

A hyphenated name was then suggested that would allow the chapter the flexibility to service a wider area of Montgomery County than initially thought. The decision was made that for the time being the proposed chapter would be referred to as Triple A or "AAA", which would if chartered be the Abington-Ambler Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi.

A petition for a charter was submitted to the Northeastern Province in early September of 2004. The petition of ten names was rejected with a note from Northeastern Province Polemarch, to reapply in one year.

### The Kappas of Abington Ambler-

Determined to earn their charter, the small group of Kappa Brothers continued meeting, performing community service and reclaiming Brothers under the name "Kappa's of Abington-Ambler", even launching their own youth development program, Kappa Akademy.

The application for a charter was resubmitted, this time with the names of 18 Kappa Brothers. The application was accepted and steps were put in place to install the chapter. The chartering ceremony was held on October 22, 2005, presided over by the Northeastern Province Polemarch Michael Brewington and attended by friends, family, and dignitaries from the Northeastern Province.
